Abstract

The research that culminated into the Bengali book *Covid-Kale Bipannata O Sanhati* with the support of the Institute for Human Sciences (IWM), Vienna, aimed at exploring and developing a comprehensive understanding of the work of the awardees of Krishna Trust in the last nine years, who received award to facilitate education and public health issues among women and children in their respective localities. This academic work attempts to bring to light how the social leaders and mobilisers of social work, and solidarity, caregivers, providers, in Bengal, especially women, working tirelessly through obstacles and breaking barriers during Covid-19 induced lockdown in their villages, *bustees*, neighbourhoods or localities, settlements, towns, cities.
